 - Bank accounts with named beneficiaries
3. Power of Attorney (ends upon death)
4. Health Care Directive and a HIPAA release so your family can receive your health information.
5. Statement of Desires. This letter from you would list items and passwords for things like social media, cloud storage, cell phone photos and more. These items are your property, and creating this list will be valuable information.

The donut project that had just been completed fit the grant perfectly, so it was applied for with the hopes of creating this project with others within our community and share His message as well. With great thanks to the funding from the Ohio Arts Council, we are now able to share this project with our community and the surrounding communities in our area.

Soaring Arts has hosted numerous events at Studio Express over the past 3 months and have also traveled to work with many different groups around the area to both paint and create donuts. Artists like Amanda G. (cover), enjoy teaching the classes and creating donuts. Thanks to them, our community has been creating beautiful, collaborative art pieces that represents individuality, uniqueness, inclusion and diversity through art.

We would like to thank those who have already participated in this project and the Ohio Arts Council for this opportunity. Like many other successful projects, it would not be nearly as amazing if not for the creativity of the Artists and the support of our communities.

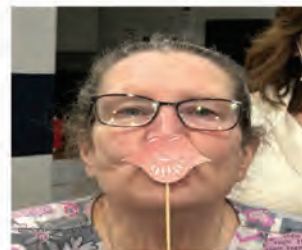

Hanson Aquatic Therapy Center - Help for Chronic Pain

Water exercises are a great workout option because they provide a non- or very-low-impact option for working out. For those with hip, knee, or leg pain, water exercises can allow your body to relieve pain and build muscle without causing more damage.

Water exercises are particularly helpful for arthritis pain, hip and knee pain and fibromyalgia pain.

WebMD considers water exercises one of the best forms of exercise for fibromyalgia patients. The CDC also notes that: "For people with arthritis, it improves use of affected joints without worsening symptoms. People with rheumatoid arthritis have more health improvements after participating in hydrotherapy than with other activities. Water-based exercise also improves the use of affected joints and decreases pain from osteoarthritis. It is also reported that "In one 12-week study, women who exercised in warm water for 60 minutes, 3 times a week reported improved physical and mental well-being. They also had less fibromyalgia pain and more vitality. As for their state of mind, they reported feeling less depressed, and more sociable."



While there are many benefits to water exercises, it's important to know some basic guidelines before starting out with any workout routine. Make sure to:

- Talk to your doctor before beginning any new exercise program, including water exercises
- Avoid water exercises if you have a fever, severe heart failure, or any infection
- Incorporate some additional land-based weight-bearing exercises if you suffer from osteoporosis, as water exercises won't build bone density.
