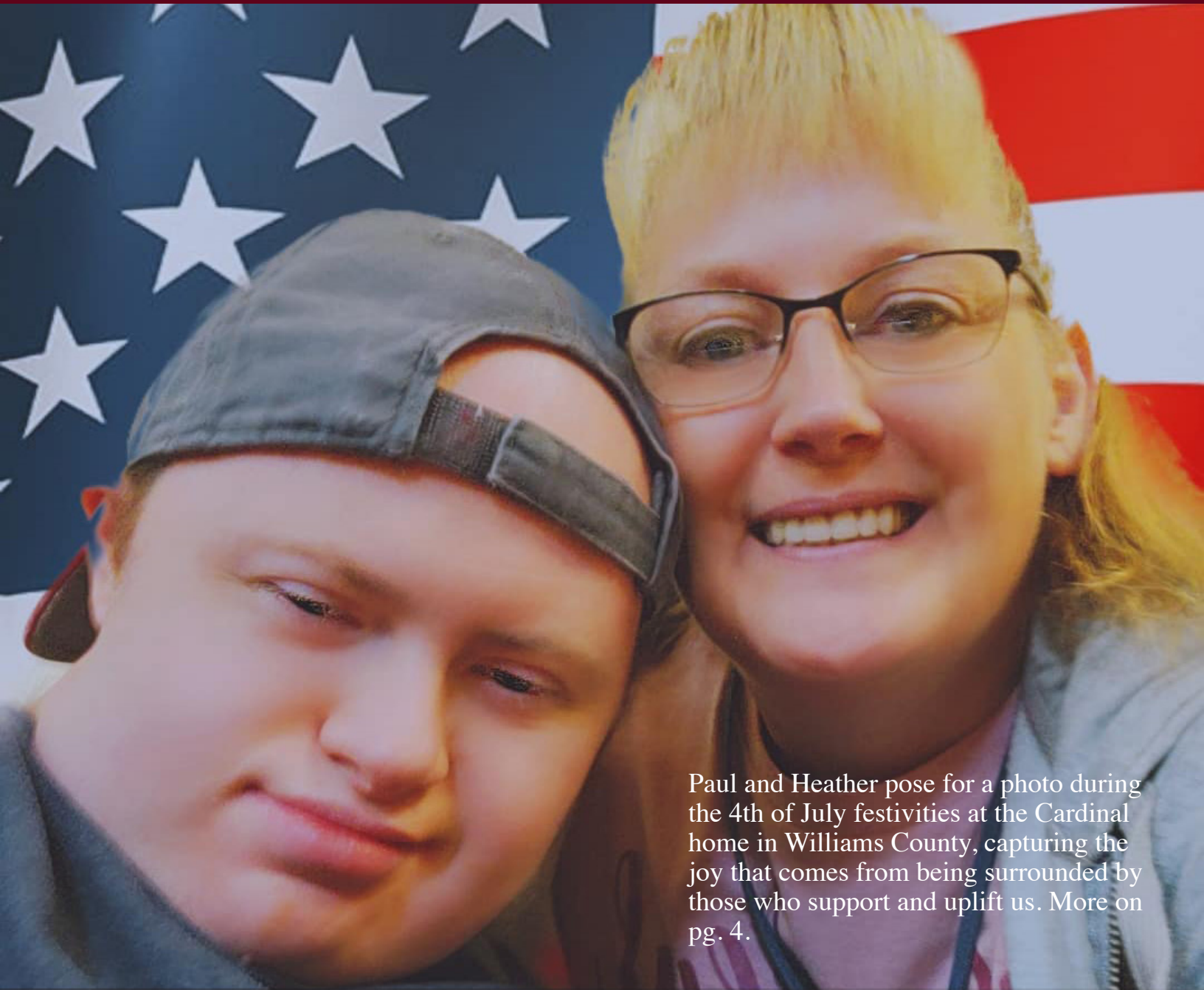

Creative Rest - 2024



Soaring Arts Studios has received a grant from The Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (ELCA) of Northwestern Ohio Synod for community activities revolving around "Creative Rest." Over the next 4-5 months, the artists and staff will be doing a lot of activities that promote slowing down and finding rest for our minds, bodies and spirits through mindfulness, creativity, play, writing, music and etc.

There will be many free activities, such as "CAN" (Community Art Nights) Rest." This will be held on Tuesdays from 4-7PM and will be open studio nights where the community can come and have a space to relax and create. Each night will have a specific theme, and one of the Studio Artists and staff will be there to guide participants into the creative rest activity, and then let guests create independently. Community members are welcome to stay the whole time or come and go as they'd like.

Creative Rest Kits will be popping up in coffee shops and spaces in Henry and Williams County to guide customers in creative rest activities, in the midst of their busy lives.

Interactive pop-up art installations are also planned and will be showing up randomly in our communities. These will be a call-out for people to slow down and unexpectedly interact with their surroundings and art.

Finally, there will be some month-long planned creative rest activities hosted by a few local churches that will allow participants to be creative in many different ways. It will then be followed up with a church member art show, displaying their mindful creations, created throughout the month.

We are all very excited about this project and thankful to the ELCA of Northwestern Ohio Synod for the Grant that will make it all possible.

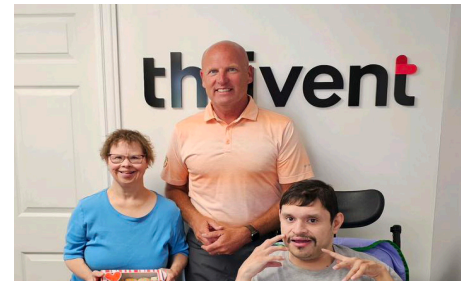

Street home along with her roommates, Nicholas, Kelly and Ann. Their kindness has opened new doors of opportunity and independence for this home. This gift is more than a vehicle; it is a symbol of compassion and support that will have a lasting impact on their lives.

GRANT AWARDED

A Bureau of Workers Compensation (BWC) Grant was given to Filling Homes (FH) for a little over \$29,500 with Filling Homes matching that amount at \$9,900. The match is made possible by our generous donors, pledging unrestricted gifts that are available for us to use when opportunities like the BWC Grant are available.

Over 80% of FH residents utilize wheelchairs for their mobility and that means that several transfers, pivots and other mobility supports are performed by staff on a daily basis. With clients ranging from 100-300 pounds, these transfers put staff at risk for injury, back aches and other strains. Lifting, pushing, pulling, slips and falls are all risk factors that our staff face on a regular basis during their workday. With the assistance of this grant, FH purchased new, state of the art equipment that will provide for ergonomically correct lifting techniques and personal care opportunities.
