






A Fresh Face for Filling Homes' One True Mission

The Guild Wraps Up the Filling Fall Fling for Another Year

With a \$20,000 matching funds pledge from Mrs Mary Ellen Nerod in their arsenal, the Filling Homes' Guild had a very clear view to raising \$40,000 for Filling Homes Transportation Fund, and they did not miss the mark!

Like a well-oiled machine, the Guild began gathering far in advance of the November event, which is always held the 2nd Saturday in November, to prepare for the iconic Filling Fall Fling's 17th return to benefit 140+ residents and clients served by the organization. Mission in Motion



Kim and the Residents of her living area recently sent this thank you note to the Northwest Ohio Aquarium Society in appreciation of their generosity and friendship.

One of the great things about being a Direct Support Professional is that pursuing your own interests can be part of the job. In fact, when that happens, the people served by Fiiling Homes reap the benefits!

At Filling Homes' Main Campus, one living area's membership in the Northwest Ohio Aquarium Society is a testament to that pursuit of interests. Staff member, Kim Wright, has been working in direct care with Filling Homes' residents for more than 20 years. Anyone who has worked with a coworker for 20 years, or been married for 20 years, or has been a parent 20 years knows that is a long Relationship. A 20-year relationship creates close bonds of love, familiarity and trust. That is exactly how Kim describes her relationship with the residents in her living area. "They are family to me," she said. Just like that brother or sister, who always wants a pet—or many pets—Kim has shared her love for animals with the residents for years.

For the last few years, Kim has worked on bringing fish into the living area. She requested a 5-gallon aquarium, so she could share some small fish, guppies and such, from her home fish tank. Once established, Kim was searching social media for ways to get more involved. She came across the Aquarium

Society and decided to start attending meetings with one resident at a time. The Aquarium Society turned out to be a great resource and great community! After one conversation, a 20-gallon aquarium that could house much larger fish was donated by the Society!

And so it continues...every first Sunday of the month. Kim, on her day off, picks up a resident from Filling. With a supper packed from the kitchen, they make the trip to Toledo for the meeting. They listen to the informational segment, participate in the livestock auction and enjoy the company and refreshments:)

Every resident that is interested in going has been to a meeting and gotten a t-shirt. A second 20-gallon aquarium has since been donated by the Aquarium Society, and the friendships continue to grow. Well done, Kim!

Keepers of the Mission

A lot has been going on behind the scenes at Filling Homes to try to address the challenges of bringing in new direct care staff and retaining the current staff. In less than a month, Filling Homes will come together to celebrate staff members who celebrated milestone anniversaries in 2022. Thirty-four employees have reached these special anniversaries: 5 years – 17; 10 years – 11; 15 years – 3; 25 years – 2; and 40 years – 1! The fact that, on average, 150 people are hired per year illustrates the struggle we have keeping them to celebrate their 5-year anniversary and beyond. By comparison, in 2014, we celebrated 34 staff for the 5-year mark alone!

As we begin a new year, strategies for achieving the goals of employee recruitment and retention and improved attendance have been instituted. A number of policies and rewards have either been developed or updated. Among these included referral bonuses, shift incentives and attendance bonuses. Please pray for the positive results of these efforts.

As always, our paramount concern is to continue the standard of care and support that our Residents and Clients deserve. The 34 individuals that we will soon honor represent only a fraction of the outstanding staff employed for 5 years or more. We are so thankful to be able to depend on all of them to carry out Filling Homes' mission of excellence.

Soaring Arts Recognized Among County's Economic Development Contributors

A contingent of Filling Homes staff accepted an invitation to the Henry County Community Improvement Corporation (CIC) Annual Meeting to represent Filling Homes' place in the economic growth and development of Henry County and to support Soaring Arts Studio as a recipient of the CIC's Service Award for Downtown Revitalization.

Jenny Borgelt, Director of Community Services, and Jamie Halley, Adult Day Services Program Coordinator, accepted the award on behalf of Soaring Arts. The nights event also featured a silent auction in which the items for bid were supplied by Soaring Arts Studio. All proceeds from the auction were donated back to the Studio. The exposure and funds were a win/ win for Soaring Arts and Filling Homes!

Soaring Arts Studio and its contributions to the community continue to grow awareness of Filling Homes' mission and great reputation for supporting people with Developmental Disabilities throughout all of Henry County and Northwest Ohio!

Zion Endowments Funding Blesses Filling Homes Critical CPR Training Equipment and Upgraded Meeting Facilities

The fruits of two Endowment grants from two Zion churches have now been realized and are daily benefitting the work being done at Filling Homes.

First, the Mission Endowment Fund of Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church in Waterville celebrated its 18th awarding of grants that "bring mission to life". These grants totaled \$147, 200 and went to 19 nonprofit organizations last year. Filling Homes, with an award of \$4,200 was one of them. With this funding, we have been able to equip a virtual conference room to enable residents to meet with their families and off-site staff members to join meetings without incurring the costs of travel. All applicants are sponsored by Zion's members. This year, Melissa Peper-Firestone submitted the application for Filling Homes.

Additionally, Zion's Lutheran Church of Defiance awarded eight grants from its Endowment Fund totaling \$8,384. Former LMM board member and current Zion's Endowment

> committee member, Steve Graf delivered Filling Homes portion of this year's disbursement in the amount of \$2,234. This funding was used to purchase new, diversity-sensitive CPR Manikins to increase the equipment available for staff training. New hires are required to receive this training and all certificates must be renewed every two years. With 300+ employees, the added Manikins allow for more efficient compliance and for assured safety of the residents and clients we serve.

Chapel Gets New Carpet



he Filling Homes' chapel has new carpet thanks to the \$100,000 donated by Mrs Mary Ellen Nerod last year.
